Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

HIS BLOOD IS SUFFICIENT!

Jesus has gathered his disciples together for the Last Supper. As these men gather around him, he holds up the cup and begins to explain that *his blood is the New Covenant and that his blood is sufficient.* Where as in the Old Law, the blood of goats and bulls for 4000 years has not met the requirements for the fulfilling of the law, **HIS BLOOD IS SUFFICIENT.**



This is what He was talking about when he said that He had come to fulfill the law not do away with it. That He in one selfless loving act would do what no other sacrifice had been able to do and would begin a new covenant with the God of Creation. A blood covenant that if anyone would trust in the power of this blood, they would receive: redemption, atonement, healing, protection, deliverance, strength and transformation.

JESUS' BLOOD REDEEMS US. There is wonder working power in the precious blood of the Lamb of God, power to take away the sins of the world. The law was hard; It was almost a curse upon mankind. No one could be pure enough, good enough, holy enough to obey the entire law. The law held men in bondage, and showed every imperfection in humanity. But the blood of Jesus freed us from the curse of sin and death. Jesus' blood has the power to transform. It is the blood of Jesus that when applied to our lives makes the chiefest, vilest of sinners, transforms them body soul and spirit into a new creature formed in the image of God's Holiness.

JESUS' BLOOD HAS THE POWER TO GIVE LIFE. Blood is our source of life; without it coursing through our veins life will cease in this physical body. We cannot survive without blood. Without the blood of Christ applied to our spirit & soul we are bound for the certainty of the second death. **HIS BLOOD HAS THE POWER TO HEAL AND PROTECT.** Whenever a virus attacks our physical body and begins to make us sick, our blood begins to fight with all that it has attacking this virus with white blood cells. When the enemy of your soul rises up against you, the blood of our Lord and Saviour covers us like a shield & that enemy that would destroy our soul is repealed. Why? Because there is wonder working power in the blood of the Lamb. When your body suffers an injury, a cut, your blood does this wonderful thing to protect you from infection it forms a scab.

JESUS' BLOOD HAS THE POWER TO DELIVER US.. It is the power of the blood of Jesus that breaks the yoke of bondage of sin from our lives. He does not just forgive us and leave us in the grips of Satan but by the power of the blood of Christ we experience freedom from sin. Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage. (Galatians 5:1)

AND HIS BLOOD IS STILL POWERFUL TODAY. His blood is still saving sinners, setting captive free today. His Blood is sufficient!

SPIRITUALITY OF HOLY WEEK

On **Palm Sunday**, we celebrate the first joy of the season, as we celebrate Our Lord's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem where he was welcomed by crowds worshiping him and laying down palm leaves before him. It also marks the beginning of Holy Week, with the greatest tragedy and sorrow of the year. Jesus' triumphant return to Jerusalem is only one side of the story. By now many of the Jews are filled with hate for Our Lord. They want to see him stoned, calling Him a blasphemer, especially after offering proof of His Divinity during a winter visit to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Dedication.



Jesus took refuge at Ephrem returning six days before Passover to Bethany, triumphantly entering Jerusalem. That evening, He leaves Jerusalem and returns Monday. He spent time with Gentiles in the Temple, and on Wednesday left for the Mount of Olives. Here he foretold the apostles the events of the next several days, including His impending death.

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. The holy day falls on the Thursday before Easter and is part of Holy Week. Jesus celebrated the dinner as a Passover feast. Christ would fulfil His role as the Christian victim of the Passover for all to be saved by His final sacrifice. The Last Supper was the final meal Jesus shared with his Disciples in Jerusalem. During the meal, Jesus predicts his betrayal.



The central observance of Holy Thursday is the ritual re-enactment of the Last Supper at Mass. This event is celebrated at every Mass, as party of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, but it is specially commemorated on Holy Thursday. He also establishes the special priesthood for his disciples, which is distinct from the "priesthood of all believers." Christ washed the feet of his Disciples, who would become the first priests. This establishment of the priesthood re-enacted at Mass with the priest washing the feet of several parishioners.

During the Passover meal, Jesus breaks bread and gives it to his Disciples, uttering the words, "This is my body, which is given for you." Subsequently, he passes a cup filled with wine. He then says, "This is my blood..."

We will celebrate the Resurrection on our return. At each celebration many parents were present to participate making them very reverent community experiences.



Good Friday is the day on which Catholics commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Catholics are joined by almost all other Christians in solemn commemoration on this day. It is also a legal holiday around much of the world. According to the gospels, Jesus was betrayed by Judas on the night of the Last Supper, commemorated on Holy Thursday. The morning following Christ's arrest, he was brought before Annas, a powerful Jewish cleric. Annas condemned Jesus for blasphemy for refusing to repudiate Annas' words that He was the Son of God. From there, Jesus was sent to Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of the province. Pontius Pilate questioned Jesus but found no reason to condemn Him. Instead, he suggested Jewish leaders deal with Jesus according to their own law. But under Roman law, they could not execute Jesus, so they appealed to Pilate to issue the order to kill Jesus.

Pilate appealed to King Herod, who found no guilt in Jesus and sent Him back to Pilate once again. Pilate declared Jesus to be innocent, and washed his hands to show that he wanted nothing to do with Jesus, but the crowds were enraged. To prevent a riot and to protect his station, Pilate reluctantly agreed to execute Jesus and sentenced him to crucifixion. Jesus was convicted of proclaiming himself to be the King of the Jews.

The St Vincent de Paul Society has a rich and influential history. It was founded in France by a group of young men in 1833, the principal founder being a 20 year old man named Frederic Ozanam. At the time, the people of France were experiencing

tremendous political and social upheaval – changes of government, the industrial revolution and the unjust employment practices. Ozanam gathered some colleagues and began to respond in practical ways to the poverty and hardship that he saw in the lives of the people around him. They visited people in their homes and offered friendship and support. This practice, known today as “home Visitation”, remains a core activity for the St Vincent de Paul Society and our members. Blessed Frederic Ozanam was beatified in Paris by Pope John Paul II on August 22 /1997.




 **We can use your postage stamps from your mail**
