### IS YOUR SECURITY SECURED?

A religious nun surprised her community several years ago when she requested for a full time ministry to help rich people... The Mother superior was not impressed with her proposal and stated that she should serve the poor rather than the rich who possess everything they need. I never heard again

if the nun's permission was granted or rejected. I hope she got permission, for whether the person is rich or poor, the key word is not rich or poor, but **person**. Rich people are fortunate in some aspects, but in other ways they can be hurting, lonely and more hungry than the poor.

In our gospel today, we meet a rich young man asking Jesus a question: **"Master, what must I do to gain eternal life?"** And Jesus replied: **"You must not kill, no adultery, no stealing, etc.."** The young man said: **"I have kept all these from my earliest days."** Jesus replied: **"There is one more you have to do. Sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor and you will have treasures in heaven."** The young man left sad for he is a man of great wealth. This young man needs encouragement to be less attached to his wealth so that he can better follow the Lord. Many rich people are despair-prone, for they experience no pleasure in simple things. We bring nothing in this world when we were born and so we will take nothing out.

The rich man in today's gospel was invited by Jesus to be a close friend. Only the Lord knows what had been in store, but his riches would not release him for he could not release them. If we are materially rich, we should have a Christian outlook on our possessions. If we are poor, we should also need some guidelines about monetary values in life. One might note these few suggestions:

1. Remember you must let go sometime.
2. Find joy in giving rather than grabbing.
3. Live by the sign of the cross (+ ) not the sign of the dollar (\$)
4. Be assured that material wealth is fleeting security. Is your security secured?

The asylum seekers have written a letter to Malcolm Turnbull to congratulate him on his elevation to Prime Minister and asking him to look at their quest for freedom. The asylum seekers say they understand and support government policies, designed to save lives at sea

" because we saw death with our own eyes, but at the moment we are experiencing gradual death at detention for more than two years, that affects our mental health daily. We see men cutting themselves as they are suffering". We should put ourselves it their shoes and see if we like being locked up in detention centres especially the children, Mr Turnbull says it a total cabinet agreement for policy change, so we can only pray that common sense and compassion are at the forefront of the meeting producing a policy which will allow the asylum seekers freedom and resettlement which they crave for.





**Question: Do Natural Laws and Systems come from God? // Why does Genesis depict Creation as Six Days? Do natural laws and natural systems come from God also?**

Yes. The laws of nature and natural systems are also part of God's creation.

Man is not a blank slate. He is shaped by the order and the natural laws that God has inscribed in his creation. A Christian does not simply do "whatever he wants". He knows that he harms himself and damages his environment when he denies natural laws, uses things in ways contrary to their intrinsic order, and tries to be wiser than God, who created them. It demands too much of a person when he tries to design himself from start to finish.

**Why does the Book of Genesis depict creation as the work of six days?**

The symbol of the work week, which is crowned by a day of rest (Gen 1:1-2:3), is an expression of how good, beautiful, and wisely ordered creation is.

From the symbolism of "the work of six days" we can derive important principles: (1) Nothing exists that was not called into being by the Creator. (2) Everything that exists is good in its own way. (3) Something that has become bad still has a good core. (4) Created beings and things are interrelated and interdependent. (5) Creation in its order and harmony reflects the surpassing goodness and beauty of God. (6) In creation there is an order of complexity:

man is superior to an animal, an animal is superior to a plant, a plant is superior to inanimate matter. (7) Creation is heading for the great celebration when Christ will bring the world home and God will be everything to everyone. (YOUCAT questions 45-46)

**Question - Why did God Rest on the 7th Day? // Why did God Create the World?**

**Why did God rest on the seventh day?**

God's rest from his work points toward the completion of creation, which is beyond all human efforts.

Although man in his work is the junior partner of his Creator (Gen 2:15), he can by no means redeem the world by his toil. The goal of creation is "new heavens and a new earth" (Is 65:17) through a redemption that is given to us as a *gift*. Thus the Sunday rest, which is a foretaste of heavenly rest, is superior to the work that prepares us for it.

**Why did God create the world?**

"The world was made for the glory of God" (First Vatican Council).

There is no other reason for creation than love. In it God's glory and honor appears. To praise God, therefore, does not mean applauding the Creator. After all, man is not a spectator to the work of creation. For him, "praising" God means being grateful for his own existence together with all creation.

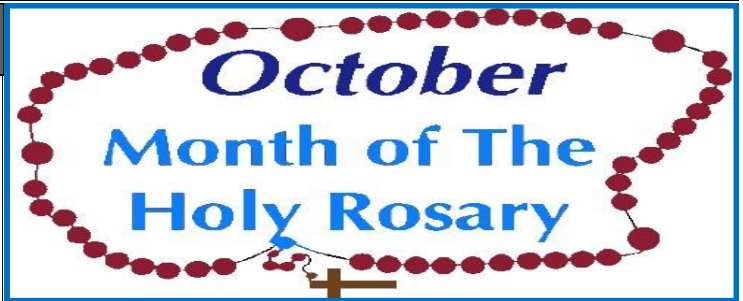
