## THE NATURE OF GOD

*Fr. Marce Singson*

In our Gospel today from St. Luke, Jesus was accused of a serious offense. The Pharisees and Scribes were murmuring that Jesus “welcomes sinners and eats with them.” They observed that Jesus was associating with the wrong groups of people: tax collectors, sinners, women, poor fishermen. Any self-respecting rabbi would have nothing to do with such groups of people.



The association of Jesus with sinners offers us an insight of the nature of God. God is forgiving, accepting, loving. We are not sinners in the hands of an angry God. Rather, we are sinners whom our loving Father wants to embrace and heal through his love. Ours is a God who celebrates and rejoices when we come to our senses and return to him. As portrayed in our Gospel today: God is like a shepherd who abandons the 99 sheep and goes in search of the stray until he finds it. God, is like a woman

who loses a silver coin and cannot rest until she finds it. All of these images tell of the nature of our God: forgiving, accepting, loving.

Our second reading today (Letter of Paul to Timothy) puts it in the following way: “You can depend on this as worthy of full acceptance: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.” Even our first reading today from Exodus contains a story of God’s unbounded mercy and love. His people were worshipping a golden calf. God threatens to destroy them all. But Moses appeals to God’s faithful love, and the Lord relents and spares them.



The nature of God should also be our nature as his followers. As individuals and as a community of faith, we are challenged to be a people of forgiving, accepting and loving. This is our greatest challenge as Christians and this is our mission as well. We should be a Church that seeks the lost and hurt.

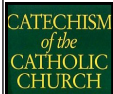
Effective immediately there will no longer be Mass celebrated at the Yurana Nursing Home. Arrangements will be made during the year for special blessings for the catholic residents.

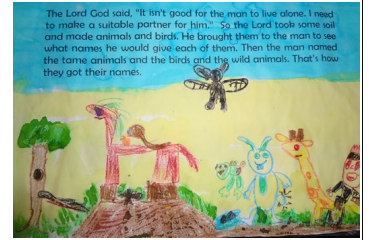
The term is rapidly coming to a close and it has been another great term. There has been so much wonderful learning happening! It is always great to share a few student learning examples:

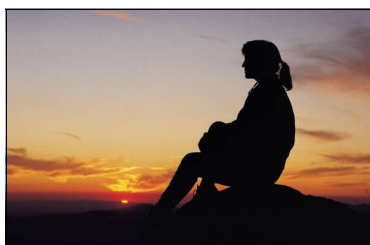

### TAKE A QUIET MOMENT TO REFLECT.....

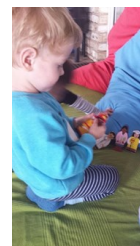
