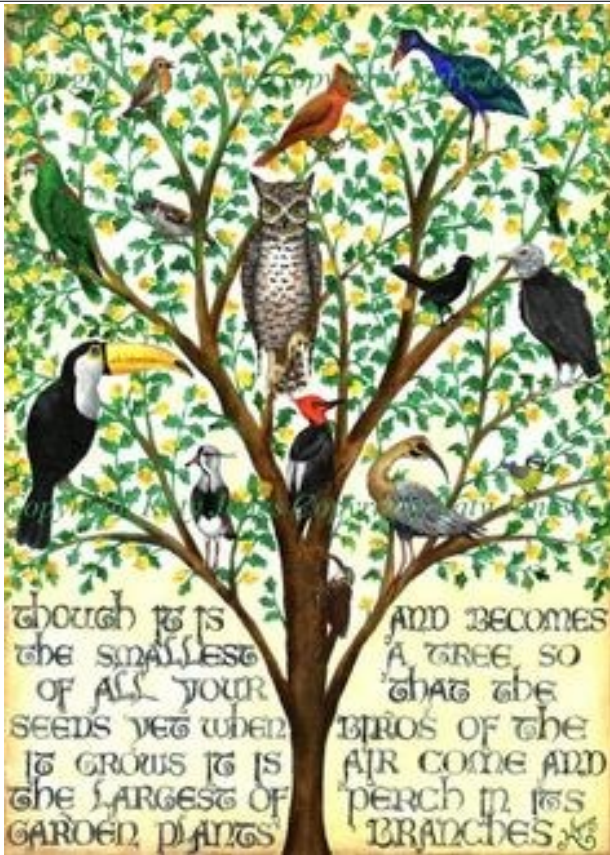

## CONFIDENCE

*by Fr. Marce Singson*



Confidence is active. Presumption is passive. Confidence is multi-directional. Presumption looks only outward. Confidence is strong yet humble. Arrogance is weak yet appears unshaken. Confidence is shown by deeds. Arrogance relies on words but seldom moves to action. Confidence is grounded on courage. Arrogance floats in fear. Confidence is substantial. Arrogance is based on appearances. Confidence endures. Presumption and arrogance are passing.

Our confidence sometimes grows weak with the just realization that our human resources are so limited. We may feel like the mustard seed, smallest of all seeds. This can

lead us into two paths: despair or genuine confidence. We can simply give up and believe that virtue and holiness are beyond human powers. We feel God is asking too much of us. We think God is unreasonable. Why even try? We are bound to fail anyway. Our sins become too great to forgive. We become wanderers on the earth.

The realisation of our own finitude and the need for God's grace can lead to confidence. The small mustard seed can spring into the largest shrub. How is this done? By placing total trust and confidence in God. God's grace works through our human weakness. Our limitations can open us up to the possibility of letting God's work be our own. If we deny our limitations and refuse to accept God's grace at work in us then we become arrogant.

In the final analysis, confidence in God draws others to us. It makes us approachable and of service to others in need. We can use the tree image as presented in our first reading and gospel reading today. A confident person is like a plant which is nurtured by God's love and provides shade and rest for those in need. Such a person is fruitful and generous with the many gifts from the Lord.

Confidence should not be confused with presumption, arrogance or despair. Real confidence is knowing (in faith) that our few resources, lowly condition and withered heart will be magnified by the Lord, exalted by his grace, and bloom with the lasting fruit of the Spirit.
