Pentecost Sunday

14th - 15th May 2016

WIND AND FIRE

Today is the celebration of Wind and Fire. The word “Pentecost” per se, doesn’t adequately describe this celebration. “Pentecost” is simply a Greek word which means: “50th day,” that means, the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus. On this day however, the apostles and the other first Christians truly got ecstatic about their mission of preaching about Jesus.

They were all inspired.

The dramatic story of Pentecost is told in the Acts of the Apostles. It tells how God “put a tiger in the Church’s tank,” and how the Church started to move, expand and boldly preach to people everywhere. Some were willing, even anxious to die like the young Stephen, our protomartyr. Some did a complete turnabout with their lives, like Paul. Others found themselves not only able to speak in unknown tongues but to work miracles. Peter healed a crippled man. The leaders of the first Christian community were no longer afraid to face the world as preached Jesus boldly in public, for they had the Holy Spirit. They were going out and speaking out.

Pentecost, we emphasize, is not only for Pentecostals – any more than baptism is only for the Baptists. Although interpreted in various ways, Pentecost is for all Christian believers. To live Pentecost we need not pray in tongues, hold or raise hands up in the air, or punctuate statements with “amen,” or “praise the Lord.” These statements are praiseworthy if natural and sincere, but to be Pentecostal is to be Spirit-filled. To speak truthfully and to fight what is morally right is to imitate the spirit of Pentecost. To live according to the teachings of Christian values is to live in the spirit of Pentecost. To remain faithful to God through the Church is to live a Spirit-filled life.

Today’s liturgical celebration is meant to move us in the flow of the Holy Spirit and make it hard to sit still. There is a lot of good news to inspire us and enable others to see and feel the Wind and Fire.

History of Mother's Day: Mothering Sunday




The more recent history of Mothers Day dates back to 1600s in England. Here a Mothering Sunday was celebrated annually on the fourth Sunday of Lent (the 40 day period leading up to Easter) to honour mothers. After a prayer service in church to honour Virgin Mary, children brought gifts and flowers to pay tribute to their own mothers.

On the occasion, servants, apprentices and other employees staying away from their homes were encouraged by their employers to visit their mothers and honour them.

Traditionally children brought with them gifts and a special fruit cake or fruit-filled pastry called a simnel. Yugoslavs and people in other nations have observed similar days.

Custom of celebrating Mothering Sunday died out almost completely by the 19th century. However, the day came to be celebrated again after World War II, when American servicemen brought the custom and commercial enterprises used it as an occasion for sales.

Last week our children took some time at our Mothers Day Stall to lovingly choose the right gift for their mothers.






The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May. Our year 3 and 5 students completed the assessment this week.

CATECHISM
of the
CATHOLIC CHURCH

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Let's get to know our faith.

Question: Was Mary only an instrument of God?

Mary was more than a merely passive instrument of God. The Incarnation of God took place through her active consent as well. When the angel told her that she would bear "the Son of God", Mary replied, "Let it be to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38). The redemption of mankind by Jesus Christ thus begins with a request by God and the free consent of a human being and a pregnancy before Mary was married to Joseph. By such an unusual path Mary became for us the "Gate of Salvation".

Question: Why is Mary our mother also?

Mary is our mother because Christ the Lord gave her to us as a mother. "Woman, behold, your son! ... Behold, your mother!" (Jn 19:26b-27a). The second command, which Jesus spoke from the Cross to John, has always been understood by the Church as an act of entrusting the whole Church to Mary. Thus Mary is our mother, too. We may call upon her and ask her to intercede with God. (YOUCAT questions 84-85)

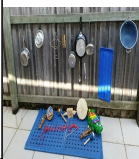
