THE GOD WHO SEARCHES

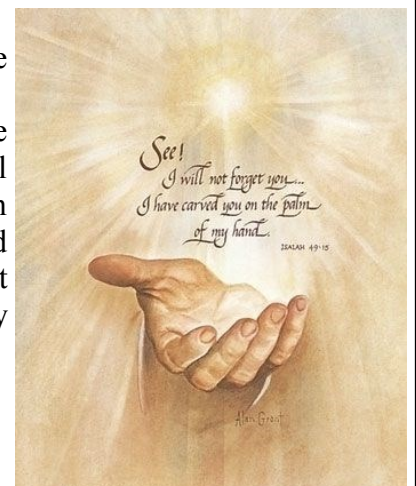
“Zacchaeus, hurry down. I mean to stay at your house today.”
Jesus

The story of Zacchaeus in our Gospel today is a powerful example of God’s forgiving love at work in the ministry of Jesus. Zacchaeus is the chief tax collector, a wealthy man. But he is also widely hated by people. He is considered a sinner. No self-respecting Jew would like to associate with him. We might expect Jesus to also shun such a person. But such is not the case. Jesus searches Zacchaeus (who climbed on a tree to see Jesus because he is of small stature) and takes the lead: “Zacchaeus, hurry down. I mean to stay at your house today.” To speak to such a person is bad enough. But to go to his house and accept his hospitality is shocking. Yet this is exactly what happens. This is the way God searches for us.

Why does Jesus do such a thing? Is he not afraid of giving a bad example? But Jesus makes it clear: “The Son of Man came to search out and save what was lost.” What is a “bad example” by human standards is the gracious and forgiving love of God at work in our lives. Note the reaction of Zacchaeus. He is a changed man. He will not allow group pressure or gossip to keep him from Jesus. He told Jesus: “If I have defrauded anyone I pay him back fourfold.” There is a profound joy and liberation. Salvation has come to Zacchaeus.

The story of Zacchaeus is our story, too. The God who searches out the wealthy tax collector searches for us as well. When we accept our sinfulness, the grace of God will actively work in us. Then we begin to live in a new and liberating life like Zacchaeus. God is involved in a long search for us. That search is going on right now in this Holy Mass.

Will we allow God to find us?

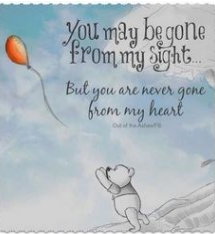

WHY PRAY FOR THE DEAD?

In all funerals that I presided over, people say with some assurance, “he’s in a better place now” or “she’s in heaven,” as if their loved one’s immediate arrival in heaven were a foregone conclusion. In our grief we want to believe our loved ones go right to heaven but the truth is, we don’t exactly know where they go.

The Bible provides evidence that there can be no imperfections in heaven. (Too pure are your eyes to look upon evil, and the sight of misery you cannot endure. (Hab. 1:13). According to the Catechism, most of us who don’t merit hell yet still need purification before we can enter heaven, will pass through a state the Church calls purgatory when we die: *“All who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.”* (CCC 1030).

What is purgatory like? Most of the saints’ descriptions involve fire. St Paul writes:

“If anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw, the work of each will come to light, for the Day will disclose it. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire [itself] will test the quality of each one’s work. If the work stands that someone built upon the foundation, that person will receive a wage. But if someone’s work is burned up, that one will suffer loss; the person will be saved, but only as through fire.” (1 Cor. 3:12-15)

The fire may be metaphorical, since the souls in purgatory don’t have bodies. What causes them pain is their separation from God, even as they’re also joyful that they will enter heaven. The thought of a loved one suffering is motivation to pray, but there is another reason. There are three states of the Church: those on earth (Church Militant), those who have died and are being purified (Church Suffering) and those who are in glory with God (Church Triumphant). (CCC 954)

In charity, we are called to commend the souls of the faithful departed to God’s mercy and pray for them. We can help them not only through our prayers but also by having Masses offered for their souls. The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Even if our loved ones are already in heaven, it’s still beneficial to pray because another soul might need the help. Someday we ourselves may need the prayers of the living.



The 3 Masses in our parish next weekend (November 05 - 6) will be offered for the departed members of our families, relatives and friends.

Pope Francis launched the 50th World Communication Day on the 8th May 2016 and announced that it would run until the conclusion of the Year Of Mercy on Sunday 20th November 2016. For this celebration he has chosen the theme – **Communication and Mercy** – and invites us to reflect on this relationship, stating that he would like all people of good will to rediscover the power of mercy to heal wounded relationships and restore peace and harmony to families and communities. In his article, **Communication and Mercy: A Fruitful Encounter** he states that Communication has the power to build bridges, to enable encounter and inclusion, and thus enrich society. He speaks of the importance of selecting words and actions with care and mercy in an effort to avoid misunderstanding, to heal wounded memories and to build peace and harmony. He maintains that the words of Christians ought to be a constant encouragement to communion and should never try to rupture relationships and communication even in those cases where they must firmly condemn evil.
