HABAKKUK Trusting God when Life Doesn't Make Sense

There are many fascinating characters in the Bible such as Abraham, Moses. Isaiah, Elijah, Jeremiah, and so on. One rather obscure prophet with the unusual name is Habakkuk. Habakkuk lived and prophesied during the most desperate times (due to violence) just before the fall of Judah and the start when Jews were held as captives in Babylon. Thus the first reading today, the prophet Habakkuk stands before God and complains, saying:

"How long, O Lord, I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry to you, "Violence!" but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin: why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife, and clamorous discord."

In a sense, Habakkuk represents all of us during those times when everything seems to be going wrong, when perhaps we feel that God is indeed in heaven but a far distant from our very real, very troubled and violent world. Frankly, I would not dare speak to God as Habakkuk did, with the courage to complain to God and even the audacity to suggest that god should wake up and look to his business of governing the world and directing the affairs of his people in the world. Apparently, God was not displeased with Habakkuk, because God answered Habakkuk in gentle, understanding tones, saying:

"Be patient with me. I have a plan. What I ask of you is faith, and because of your faith you will live."

The faith God asked is not the kind we ordinarily think of, a mere belief that there is God. Obviously, Habakkuk believed in God; otherwise he would not have called upon him. What God meant by faith is a

LOYALTY and TRUST, a steadfast especially in the face of difficulties and serious challenges in our life. Such faith is a combination of love and confidence. Experience would tell us that it is so easy to be faithful to God when everything is going well for us, just as it is easy to be loving, kind and pleasant, to cooperative people.

God is asking that we be faithful to him, especially during our most turbulent and frustrating moments. Like the apostles in today's Gospel reading who prayed to God saying: "Lord, increase our faith!"

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

What else does the sacrament of Penance do for us?

The sacrament of Penance also gives us the opportunity to receive spiritual advice and instruction from our confessor.

What must we do to receive the sacrament of Penance worthily?

- To receive the sacrament of Penance worthily, we must:
- 1. examine our conscience;
- 2. be sorry for our sins;
- 3. have the firm purpose of not sinning again;
- 4. confess our sins to the priest;

be willing to perform the penance the priest gives us.

But if the wicked do penance for all his sins which he hath committed and keep all my commandments and do judgment and justice, living he shall live, and shall not die. (Ezekiel 18:21)

What is an examination of conscience?

An examination of conscience is a sincere effort to call to mind all the sins we have committed since our last worthy confession.

What should we do before our examination of conscience? Before our examination of conscience we should ask God's help to know our sins and to confess them with sincere sorrow.

How can we make a good examination of conscience? We can make a good examination of conscience by calling to mind the commandments of God and of the Church, and the particular duties of our state of life, and by asking ourselves how we may have sinned with regard to them.

When is sorrow for sin true contrition? Sorrow for sin is true contrition when it is interior, supernatural supreme, and universal.

Create a pure heart for me, O God, and renew in me a steadfast spirit. (Psalm 50:12)

When is our sorrow interior? Our sorrow is interior when it comes from our heart, and not merely from our lips.

My sacrifice, O God, is a contrite spirit; a contrite and humbled heart, O God, thou wilt not despise. (*Psalm* 50:19)

When is our sorrow supernatural? Our sorrow is supernatural when, with the help of God's grace, it arises from motives which spring from faith and not merely from natural motives.

When is our sorrow supreme? Our sorrow is supreme when we hate sin above every other evil, and are willing to endure any suffering rather than offend God in the future by sin.

When is our sorrow universal? Our sorrow is universal when we are sorry for every mortal sin which we may have had the misfortune to commit.

Turn thy face away from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. (Psalm 50:11)

Upon arriving and until the moment I left, the atmosphere was full of both excitement and concentration - everyone I encountered was of the most kind and friendly nature, while still remaining composed and focussed for competition. It still astounds me how different people from all over the world can be unified through a common passion for sport, and it's that same love for competing that I think helps with controlling the inevitable nerves.

I reminded myself of that when it came to the second day of competition, which meant that it was time for me to swim in the 100m backstroke. It was the only race I would swim for the whole competition, and so, I did my best and managed to place second in my heat with a finishing time that was close to the fastest I have ever swum in the event. Although there were

things I know I could've executed better in accordance to my race plan, it's hard to be disappointed when you've put in your best efforts to represent your country on the greatest stage possible in the global sporting scene.

I'd like to thank everyone in the St. Edward's Parish, especially Father Marce and my parents, for your ongoing support. As people who practice our faith in God, you've helped me to also have faith in the smaller things such as myself and my abilities, which has only made me a better athlete. Furthermore, I could not have made it this far without a strong Catholic community by my side that's kept me grounded, and also taught me to be grateful for every opportunity God has provided for me throughout all these years of training I've endured. I am truly thankful that all of you are a part of my life, and have contributed to my journey as an Olympian and a person.

At this Mass Fr Marce also holds an Anointing of the Sick. A cuppa Morning tea will be served after Mass.


