'Let me sing the song of his love for his vineyard'

This week's readings remind us that the Lord of the vineyard is the God of hosts, the master of creation and the giver of all gifts.

The texts invite us to reflect on the Lord's giving of such gifts and on our acceptance of them. We, the beneficiaries, are totally dependent on the one giving (**Psalm**). And God gives to us too, so that we can respond in a way worthy of praise (**Second Reading**).

As we read and ponder, we see that, sometimes, the gifts are met with unproductivity (**First Reading**); at other times they are even misused (**Gospel**). This week, let's pray that the God of peace, who has already promised to be with us, may find in us a 'noble' and 'virtuous' response.

GOSPEL Matthew 21: 33-43 REFLECTION

I begin my reflection on this parable of Jesus by placing myself in his presence. Even now, he is doing wonderful things for me.

Then I read the scripture, slowly, constantly asking Jesus to help me hear and see what he wants to show me. I may be drawn to the goodness of the landowner, perhaps leading me to reflect on the times I have experienced the goodness of God in my life. What is my sense of gratitude as I reflect?

Perhaps I am drawn to the person of Jesus, speaking of himself as the son of the landowner. He comes in love to offer the vineyard to me. How do I feel towards him as I hear him speak? Do I feel I am a trustworthy recipient of his gifts?

The Lord of the vineyard is the master of creation – I might end by committing myself afresh to the invitation to work in the portion of the Lord's vineyard that has been entrusted to me – my family, relationships, neighbourhood, community ... *Glory be* ...

Bookings to attend Mass

Please follow the steps below to register your booking. If you do not have a computer please call the office during business hours on 3299 2000 to make your booking. Bookings on line close 6 hours prior to the Mass time.

If you are able to assist with the cleaning after Mass we would truly appreciate the assistance.

The steps for the registration is as follows:

The easiest process is to go to our webpage www.stedwardsdaisyhill.org.au and click on the icon provided.

- Click on 'Select a Date'
- Scroll down until you find the date you require
- Then click 'Ticket'
- The next screen you can choose the number of tickets you require (1 or 2 etc) if you are living in the same house and have the same surname you can do this on the one booking otherwise you have to do separate bookings for each one. There is a limit of 4 tickets per booking so if there is more than 4 required you need to do separate bookings.
- Click 'see more' to read all the conditions of the booking
- Then click 'Register'
- That will take you to the screen when you can enter your details. In the area 'First name' you can enter all (up to 4) first names (if you have ordered multiple tickets with the one booking) then tab to the surname area. This is for all attendees that have the same surname and living at the same address. ALL NAMES ARE TO BE REGISTERED
- All the information with a * is required by the guidelines which are to be hold on record for 56 days.
- Once you click 'Register' at the bottom of this page you will receive a confirmation of the booking to your email.



Reconciliation will still be by appointment ONLY.



CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.
Q. What does "Decalogue" mean?
Decalogue means "ten words" (*Exodus 34:28*). These words sum up the Law given by God to the people of Israel in the context of the Covenant mediated by Moses. This Decalogue, in presenting the commandments of the love of God (the first three) and of one's neighbor (the other seven), traces for the chosen people and for every person in particular the path to a life freed from the slavery of sin.

Q. What is the bond between the Decalogue and the Covenant?
The Decalogue must be understood in the light of the Covenant in which God revealed himself and made known his will. In observing the commandments, the people manifested their belonging to God and they answered his initiative of love with thanksgiving.
