‘The God of Love and Peace be with you!’

One God, three persons united in a constant flow of love and tenderness! On this feast of the Most Holy Trinity, we are all invited to be drawn deeper into the rhythm of this eternal dance of love.

Moses met God in the form of a cloud

(**First Reading**). God revealed the foundational truth that underlies the commandments Moses was carrying: the Lord is compassion and tenderness, slow to anger and rich in kindness.

The **Psalm** from the Book of Daniel is an excerpt from a joyful song of praise, attributed to three men whose faith had saved them from a fiery furnace: ‘To you glory and praise for evermore’.

In Paul’s letter (**Second Reading**) we hear how the early Christian community were encouraged to embody this Trinitarian loving relationship, in how they lived and greeted one another. As we consider the restrictions we have been living under, may we truly value and cherish our bonds of friendship.

In John’s **Gospel**, Jesus reveals to Nicodemus the depth of God’s love for all people. God sent his Son so that all may have eternal life.

Our Creator God became fully human and lived as one of us, physically living out the compassion and tenderness revealed to Moses centuries before. At Pentecost, the Spirit of God was poured into the hearts of Jesus’s followers. This same Spirit of love and kindness unites us now as we pray, whether we do so alone, in a group, or in a virtual gathering.

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all.

GOSPEL

John 3: 16–18 REFLECTION

Wherever I choose to pray today, I prepare myself in silence to enter deeper into the mystery of the Trinity.

I take time to read through the Gospel slowly, asking the Spirit of truth to help me hear the word of God with an open and attentive heart. I pause in silence to allow the words to settle in my heart.

I read the passage again. It may help my prayer to imagine the meeting between Jesus and Nicodemus. As I observe them speaking, what is my attention drawn towards? How do I feel hearing Jesus speak these words? I ponder... I listen.

Where have I noticed the love of God at work in my life? What does this passage tell me about the relationship of the Trinity?

Here I am invited to enter more fully into a loving relationship with God, who is Father, Son, Spirit – Creator, Word and Wisdom. What is my response today to that invitation? I share this with God: Father, Son, and Spirit.

I close my prayer in praise of the Trinity, saying ‘*Glory be ...*’

Family Discussion

Trinity is a word that means 'made up of three', and today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity that honours our understanding of three persons in one God. Who are the three persons that make up the Trinity? Whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we are remembering that we believe in the Holy Trinity: one God who is three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. At their Baptism, Christians are baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Have a look at photos or videos from family baptisms. Make the sign of the cross on each other's forehead to remember your Baptism.

Family Activity Traditionally St Patrick was said to use the shamrock (three-leaf clover) to explain the Trinity as God who is three in one. Go for a walk or drive to your local park and go on a shamrock hunt. When you have found some, talk about how it is through the Trinity – the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit – that we come to know God.

How to Tell It's God

How can we tell it's God in the gospels? There are fewer incidents of fire and cloud there. Look for the sacrifice! Not the animal sacrifice offered in the Temple, but the divine one evident everywhere. Christ emptied himself of divine privileges and took on flesh. Jesus turned from the temptations of wealth and power, and chose service. The King of Kings cast his lot among the poor and ignorant. What might easily have been the golden touch was used to heal lepers. Instead of a career, Jesus had a brief ministry. Sacrifice was spelled out in the silhouette of a cross on a hillside.

The signs of sacrifice are fewer in the world these days, though crosses abound on buildings and dangle from the ends of chains. If we want people to believe we come in the name of God, we'll have to produce the sacrifice.

What sacrifices have you made in the name of Christ?

Celebrate the Trinity by creating something in honour of the Source of all creation; sacrificing something in the name of Jesus; and contemplating the Holy Presence in prayer.
