LETTING GO

Jesus lived 30 quiet years, the 3 years of intense active pastoral ministry, culminating in his passion and death and resurrection. After his resurrection, he resided 40 more days on earth and then returned to heaven, hence, ASCENSION. The anxious apostles protested his

departure, but the Lord said it was for the best. Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit as a vigorous presence in his newborn congregation -Christianity.

Life is an unbroken series of letting go of one phase of life and moving on to the next. We let go of the past and a familiar way of life when we move to a new neighbourhood. Aging is a slow process form this life to the next. Many times we resent the persistent pace of reality. Some parents, especially in Asian countries, find it hard to release their grown up children when their children get married. If we rebel at every hint of change whether within ourselves, family, Church or society, then the mere thought of leaving this world becomes for us frightening.

Our religious development should also keep pace with our years. It should relate to Jesus as he was at different stages of his life: from the manger to a grown up Jesus though his pastoral activities and sermons and come to Gethsemani and Calvary, to his passion and death and return and finally his return to the Father in heaven. The Church herself must age and mature, just as people do. She has moved geographically from the tiny Upper Room (Last Supper) in Jerusalem, to the Middle East, then to European countries and finally to the whole world. From a handful of believers described in the Acts of the Apostles, the Church embraces billions of followers all over the world.

A mother of one of my friends turned 89 years old last year. She became physically fragile and have lost her sense of sight and of hearing. One day, my friend told her mum to bring her to a nursing home. The mum protested: "No, I don't want to be in a nursing home because that's only for old people." We face different stages in our life. We have to embrace this reality. It is a series of accomplishing the tasks at hand, then passing to the next level; then letting go and being lifted up all the way from here to eternity.

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Let's get to know our faith.

Question: How does the Church view other religions?

The Church respects everything in other religions that is good and true. She respects and promotes freedom of religion as a human right. Yet she knows that Jesus Christ is the sole redeemer of all mankind. He alone is "the way, and the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6).

Whoever seeks God is close to us Christians. There is a special degree of "affinity" to the Muslims. Like Judaism and Christianity, Islam is one of the monotheistic religions (monotheism). The Muslims, too, revere God the Creator and Abraham as their father in faith. Jesus is considered a great prophet in the Qur'an; Mary, his Mother, as the mother of a prophet. The Church teaches that all men who by no fault of their own do not know Christ and his Church but sincerely seek God and follow the voice of their conscience can attain eternal salvation. However, anyone who has recognized that Jesus Christ is "the way, and the truth, and the life" but is unwilling to follow him cannot find salvation by other paths. This is what is meant by the saying, *Extra ecclesiam nulla salus* (outside of the Church there is no salvation). (YOUCAT question 136)

DIG DEEP FOR SVDP WINTER APPEAL

Every year the SVDP society organises a Winter Appeal throughout Australia to raise funds to provide for the poor and maginalised. It is hard to believe that in a first world country,

like Australia, there are over two million people living below the poverty line, half a million of whom are children. When promoting the appeal each parish focuses on the needs of that area. To meet Daisy Hill parish needs our conference has a two pronged attack. We ask the parishners to make a monetary donation at one of the Masses on the following weekends May 28th and 29th and June 4th and 5th. At each of the Masses envelopes will be placed on the seats and we ask that you put your donation in the envelope and seal it. Donations over \$2 are tax deductible. Your donation helps provide a counsellor for the region, housing for the homeless as well as providing programs for children that will empower them to become mature, independent adults. The second prong is the Minnie Vinnies at St

Edwards under the guidance of the APRE. It is focussing on

providing food. This will be used to address the immediate needs of families. Remember every donation counts no matter how small.
