08th—09th April 2023 Easter Sunday —Year A/1 Rejoice

O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life.

I have journeyed with Jesus through the sorrow of Holy Week, in whatever way was possible for me. Now I pray for the grace to know gladness, and the glory and joy of my Risen Lord in this Easter season. The Easter readings tell of the ways in which the first disciples came to realise the

power of Jesus's resurrection.

The **Gospel** tells the story of Mary, who goes to the tomb but finds it empty; she runs to the disciples to report her loss. Peter and John race to see for themselves. Finally they begin to understand the meaning of Jesus's words about 'rising from the dead'.



Peter (**First Reading**) gives personal witness to Cornelius of the life and death of Jesus; he has eaten with him after his resurrection! Peter proclaims that the forgiveness of the Risen Jesus is for all. In the **Second Reading**, Paul stresses that to live the life of a believer is to try to be free from sin, to live in sincerity and truth.

The **Psalm** celebrates the triumph of God over death in a love that has no end. We rejoice and are glad! This week, then, we might want to pray for our world where such love is much needed. How might I bring the joy I find in God to others?

GOSPEL John 20: 1-9 REFLECTION

I begin my prayer by becoming still in the presence of God. I ask the Holy Spirit to help me enter more fully into the joy of the Risen Jesus this Easter. Slowly, I read this familiar Gospel. I may like to place myself in the story, going with Mary of Magdala to the garden tomb before dawn, or racing with Peter and John to see what has happened.

To whom do I feel most drawn? With whom do I identify. . .? Mary, who seeks out her Beloved Lord in darkness and sorrow? Or John, who races to the tomb first but hesitates at what he sees? Or Peter, the impetuous one, who rushes in? I watch as the truth slowly dawns on each of them: He is risen! Gradually, I become aware of another presence; my risen Lord Jesus is gazing at me, calling my name. I allow the Holy Spirit to lead me as I speak with him. Or maybe, there are no words; I simply rest in the wonder of his presence, allowing his joy to fill my whole being. 

THE Church is only here because of the providence of the Holy Spirit, Brisbane Archbishop Mark Coleridge told hundreds of Catholics gathered at St Stephen's Cathedral for Chrism Mass last Thursday night. He said that without the Holy Spirit, evangelisation was nothing more than Church advertising.

He said the Plenary Council, the global synodal process, and the ordained priesthood would be meaningless without the Holy Spirit.

"But with the Holy Spirit, we are caught up in something vastly more mysterious and wonderful, something much grander and less controllable that opens up a whole new horizon of possibility," he said.

"The Church becomes the body of Christ; wounded, yes, but aglow with the light of Easter, which nothing and no one can dispel."

Archbishop Coleridge said trusting in the Holy Spirit could be challenging for some people. He said people preferred to trust in their own planning, structures, and strategies.

Pope out of hospital, celebrates Palm Sunday

"I'M still alive," Pope Francis joked to reporters who asked how he was doing as he left Rome's Gemelli hospital on Saturday, April 1. A day later the 86-year-old pope was celebrating Palm Sunday, fighting off coughs and looking worn and weary. On his release from hospital for treatment of bronchitis, Francis stopped his car and got out to greet well-wishers and reporters waiting outside the hospital.



He embraced a sobbing mother, whose daughter had died the night before. He reached out to the father, too, and holding their hands, he prayed with them. The pope then traced a cross on the forehead of each of them and gave them both a kiss on the cheek.

Reporters present said he also signed the cast of a boy who said he broke his arm playing soccer.

Before returning to the Vatican, he stopped to pray at the Basilica of St. Mary Major, a stop he makes before and after every trip abroad and a stop he also made in July 2021 after undergoing colon surgery at the Gemelli. "Pausing before the icon of Mary, 'Salus Populi Romani,' he prayerfully entrusted to her the children he met yesterday in the hospital's paediatric oncology and children's neurosurgery wards, all the sick and those suffering from illness and the loss of their loved ones," the Vatican press office said. When greeting the reporters outside the hospital, Pope Francis told them, "I know some of you spent the night here — that's too much. But thank you, thank you for your work of keeping people informed."
