HE'S EAGER FOR OUR LOVE

Today's Mass readings presents a very touching picture of our God. The readings seem to indicate that God is eager for our love, that he has an urgent desire and an ardent hope that we will respond freely to his goodness. The background of today's first reading is that King David, though he has many wives, lusted after Bathsheba. Bathsheba was married to Uriah, one of King David's soldiers. When Bathsheba got pregnant by King David, he saw to it that Uriah was placed in such a position during one of the battles that he would be surely killed. In effect, David compounded adultery with the crime of murder. God could have struck David on the spot. God could have done any number of ways to punish David, but God wanted his love. And so God sent Nathan the prophet to David to arouse his conscience and to make him aware of his terrible sins. God also gave David the grace of repentance. God was so eager to forgive, because God was eager for a return of love from David.



In our Gospel reading today, Jesus himself exemplified his Fathers' ardent desire for our love. The woman who washed and perfumed the feet of Jesus, as a sign of love and reverence for him, was a well-known sinner. She had experienced the merciful compassion in the teachings and actions of Jesus. The woman knew that

Jesus was her Saviour who brings her mercy and forgiveness. Her response of love to God was so great that she could not restrain herself even in the presence of Simon the Pharisee, the one invited Jesus for a meal. Simon could not understand how Jesus, acknowledged as a Rabbi and a prophet, could tolerate even the presence of the woman, let alone her touch. Jesus explained to Simon what he (Simon) had failed to grasp about God. Jesus made it clear that the woman was so responsive in love because her many sins had been forgiven her. Simon was apparently smug and complacent. He saw himself as superior to the woman, and not in need of forgiveness. He wanted no part of a God who would be quick to forgive in order to be loved.

We ourselves are weak and we are sinners. The woman shed her tears as a sign of love for Jesus. But we must remember that Jesus shed his blood for the forgiveness of our sins. That great act of love on our behalf should beget love in us for God.

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Let's get to know our faith.

Question: What is the "communion of saints"?

The "communion of saints" is made up of all men who have placed their hope in Christ and belong to him through Baptism, whether they have already died or are still alive. Because in Christ we are one Body; we live in a communion that encompasses heaven and earth.

The Church is larger and more alive than we think. Among her members are the living and the deceased (whether they are still undergoing a process of purification or are already in the glory of God), individuals known and unknown, great saints and inconspicuous persons. We can help one another even beyond the grave. We can call on our patrons and favourite saints, but also our departed relatives and friends whom we believe are already with God. Conversely, by our intercessory prayer, we can come to the aid of our dear departed who are still undergoing purification. Whatever the individual does or suffers in and for Christ benefits all. Conversely, this unfortunately means also that every sin harms the communion.

Question: Why does Mary have such a preeminent place in the communion of saints?

Mary is the Mother of God. She was united with Jesus on earth as no other human being was or could be in an intimacy that does not cease in heaven. Mary is the Queen of Heaven, and in her motherhood she is quite close to us.

Because she committed herself, body and soul, to a divine yet dangerous undertaking, Mary was taken up body and soul into heaven. Anyone who lives and believes as Mary did will get to heaven. (YOUCAT questions 146-147)

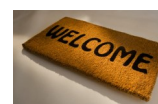
