APOLLO 13 Fr. Marce Singson



Apollo 13 was launched on April 11, 1970 from the Kennedy Space Center, Florida, but the lunar landing was aborted after an oxygen tank exploded two days later, crippling the Service Module (SM) upon which the Command Module (CM) depended. Despite great hardship caused by limited power, loss of cabin heat, shortage of potable water, and the critical need to jury-rig the carbon dioxide removal system, the crew returned safely to Earth on April 17. With help and direction from Mission Control, the astronauts were able to develop a plan for returning to the earth safely. Though they could not repair their space ship perfectly, through diligence

they worked at making the space ship as functional as possible. They did not merely aim the space ship toward the earth, where all will be well, even though the earth was their goal, they had a lot of work to do out there in space.

Our readings this weekend are all about the coming of Christ at the end of the world. This doctrine is an integral part of Christian belief and hope. The early Christians were keenly aware of this doctrine. Apparently, some Christians in Thessalonica were so convinced that Jesus' second coming is just around the corner, that they concluded that it is useless to work for a living. Hence, St. Paul in the second reading today, urged them saying: "Anyone who does not work should not eat."

The Catholic doctrine on the Second Coming of Jesus is summed up in the teaching of the Second Vatican Council:

'We do not know the time for the consummation of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how

all things will be transformed. As deformed by sin, the shape of this world will pass away. But we are taught that God is preparing a new dwelling place and a new earth where justice will abide and whose blessedness will answer and surpass all the longings for peace which spring up in the human hearth..."

What all this means to us can be symbolised in the aborted flight of Apollo 13. Our world is like Apollo 13, and our history like its journey through space. The terrible explosion of sin nearly wrecked our world for good. With help and direction from Jesus Christ, our Saviour, we are working at making this world as functional as possible. We are not moving through space toward the planet, but we are moving though time toward a moment when all will be well. That moment is the Second Coming of Christ. Though that moment is our goal, we must not spend our time in idleness. There is much work to be done on our space ship, for this world.



Question: What is meant by "the communion of saints" in the **Apostles Creed?**


Answer: By "the communion of saints" is meant the union of the faithful on earth, the blessed in heaven, and the souls in purgatory, with Christ as their Head.



In November 22, 2016 Pope Francis has released an official guideline on how we care for the ashes of the deceased. The Vatican document says: "The ashes of the deceased must be laid to rest in a sacred place, such as in a cemetery or columbarium". It goes on to state that "it is not permitted to keep the ashes in a home or to scatter them in the air, on land, at sea, or in some other way. Nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewellery, or other objects." In short, the Vatican says YES to cremation but NO to scattering of ashes anywhere.

The release of the above Vatican Guideline was very timely because it has been my dream in this parish at St. Edward's to establish a Columbarium. I presented this dream when I called for a joint meeting with the Pastoral and Finance Councils late last year. It was unanimously approved with great delight. The above photo is the impression of our future parish Columbarium. It is not made of bricks but granite. It is now being manufactured by National Granite Pty Ltd in Sydney and will be transported from Sydney to Daisy Hill and the whole structure will be mounted at the nominated site. The location of where the Columbarium will stand is very important to me because it faces the Altar and this will remind the priest who celebrates the Mass, to pray for the souls named on the Columbarium; and the congregation, too, will be reminded to pray for the deceased members of their families, relatives and friends. This Columbarium is divided into two parts: the 140 niches or holes where we place the ashes of the deceased; and the memorial wall (yellow part) which is composed of small plaques, around 150 plaques, where we put the names of our departed. I hope to finish this project before Christmas. I have appointed John Winter to supervise the construction of the Columbarium. And once the project is finished. John Guiton (who is a member of our Parish Finance Council) will take over as Parish Manager of our Columbarium. This means John Guiton is the first contact person for those who are interested to make reservations or for any concerns about the Columbarium. His contact number is 3299 5233, strictly during office hours only.

Application forms and Terms and Conditions and now ready for pick up, either at the Church, or at the Parish Office. As at 01st December these forms will be available on our parish website for your convenience. I am greatly indebted to our Parish Office Administrator Cheryl McCaffery, who was so quick in formulating the Terms and Conditions and other paper work, with the assistance of John Guiton and John Winter. Some sources of our Terms and Conditions and other paper work were drawn from the Archdiocese of Brisbane and from other surrounding parishes who have been managing a Columbarium for so many years.
