## JUDGMENT DAY

The Book of the Prophet Daniel, which is our first reading for this weekend talks about the end of time. So the world is going to end one day - but probably not yet. There is a day coming in which God will destroy the universe and all that is in it. The Bible refers to that day in various terms: the "day of judgment" (Matthew 12:36), "Christ's [second] coming" (1 Corinthians 15:23), the "great and terrible day of the Lord" (Malachi 4:5). There is another event we can predict with 100% accuracy and certainty. We are all going to die. How should we live in the light of our own mortality? How should we live in the sure and certain knowledge that the world will come to an end? How can we be ready for the end?



Don't panic. But be on your guard not to succumb to the enticements of the devil. Whenever it will happen and however it will happen, this is not our concern. But three things are perhaps our consolation: Resurrection, Retribution, and Reward.

**Resurrection.** In the progressive revelation of God's word, this is the first and only time that the phrase "everlasting life" is found in the Old Testament Bible. We have here also the promise of the bodily resurrection of the dead. That people will be awakened from "the dust of the earth" points to bodily resurrection, not simply a renewal of the soul.

**Retribution.** In contrast to the resurrection of the saved, the resurrection of the unsaved will be neither a blessing nor a deliverance (cf. John 5:28-29). The unsaved will be exposed to "shame" and "contempt" (cf. Rev 20:11-15). The word for "everlasting" originally meant "lifetime," "era," or "age." When used of God, however, it takes on the connotation of endlessness (i.e., eternity; cf. Ps 90:2). Some therefore argue for 'annihilation' that punishment in hell is for a "lifetime" or "age." Others argue that it will be everlasting in extent and experience. Either way this is a sober warning because we are told ahead of time what is yet to happen.



**Reward.** Who gets the 'reward' Daniel speaks of? "everyone whose name is found written in the book—will be delivered." (Daniel 12:1). Where is this 'book'? Jesus tells us "do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven." (Luke 10:20).

## **Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.**

### **Q. What attitude should people have toward animals?**

People must treat animals with kindness as creatures of God and avoid both excessive love for them and indiscriminate use of them especially by scientific experiments that go beyond reasonable limits and entail needless suffering for the animals.

### **Q. What is forbidden by the seventh commandment?**

Above all, the seventh commandment forbids theft, which is the taking or using of another's property against the reasonable will of the owner. This can be done also by paying unjust wages; by speculation on the value of goods in order to gain an advantage to the detriment of others; or by the forgery of checks or invoices. Also forbidden is tax evasion or business fraud; wilfully damaging private or public property; usury; corruption; the private abuse of common goods; work deliberately done poorly; and waste.

### **Q. What is the content of the social doctrine of the Church?**

The social doctrine of the Church is an organic development of the truth of the Gospel about the dignity of the human person and his social dimension offering principles for reflection, criteria for judgment, and norms and guidelines for action.

### **Q. When does the Church intervene in social areas?**

The Church intervenes by making a moral judgment about economic and social matters when the fundamental rights of the person, the common good, or the salvation of souls requires it.

### **Q. How should social and economic life be pursued?**

It should be pursued according to its own proper methods within the sphere of the moral order, at the service of the whole human being and of the entire human community in keeping with social justice. Social and economic life should have the human person as its author, center, and goal.

### **Q. What would be opposed to the social doctrine of the Church?**

Opposed to the social doctrine of the Church are economic and social systems that sacrifice the basic rights of persons or that make profit their exclusive norm or ultimate end. For this reason the Church rejects the ideologies associated in modern times with Communism or with atheistic and totalitarian forms of socialism. But in the practice of capitalism the Church also rejects self centered individualism and an absolute primacy of the laws of the marketplace over human labor.
