## A PROMISE OF PARADISE

Today's Gospel reading, preparing for us for the week ahead, is the passion account according to St. Luke. Although similar to other Gospel accounts, St Luke's account on the passion and death of Jesus make a unique contributions to enrich our faith if the suffering of Jesus. The following are some unparalleled Lucan passages:

Luke alone mentions the sweating of blood of Jesus.

Luke alone mentions the shuffling of Jesus between Pilate and Herod.

Luke alone mentions the conversations of Jesus and the two criminals as they hang on their crosses.

Also peculiar to Luke is the discourse between Jesus and the women of Jerusalem

Luke alone mentions the healing of the servant's ear which had been cut off by the sword in the garden of Gethsemane.

Hence, it appears that Luke was trying to show the ministering mercy of Jesus to the very end of his life, in spite of his own personal sufferings. Dying between the two criminals, one jeering, the other supporting, Jesus ministered with the promise of paradise. He hung between earth and sky, between God and humanity, with the rough wooden beams crossing between his head and heart. Both realistically and symbolically, Jesus was and is the centre of salvation history –never faltering but manifesting courageous love under pressure.

One final unique contribution of Luke is the passage in the garden, where an angel came to minister to Jesus. The angel is unnamed and unknown perhaps, we think, unnecessary – for what can one insignificant angel do for the Son of God? His visit does help Jesus, giving him needed strength and support simply by his presence. The human fall in the Garden of Paradise had necessitated the Garden of Gethsemane, with Jesus as the new Adam and a new beginning. While in the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus was tempted to side-step the approaching agony: "Father, if possible let this cup pass me by..." But, perhaps aided by the presence of the unknown angel, Jesus accepted the bitter choice.

Like angles, we can minister to others – even to those more powerful and intelligent – simply by our presence in times of need. On Holy Thursday we recall the Last Supper, the First Mass, the institution of the Priesthood, and the washing of the feet. But don't forget that Holy Thursday is also the anniversary of the agony in the garden. Can we, like the nameless angel, spend some quiet time with the Lord that night by our physical presence in the church? Can we also stand hear his cross the next day? We may hear him whisper our name with a promise of paradise.

#### **PARISH UPDATE**

- I attended a 2-day Annual Convocation of Clergy of the Archdiocese of Brisbane, held a Mercure Hotel in Brisbane from March 15-16. Topics tabled were: Establishment of Australian Catholic Ministers' Register, Synod on the Marriage and Family Life, Year of Mercy and Clergy Pastoral Care. The gathering was concluded with the Chrism Mass at St. Stephen's Cathedral last Wednesday.
- We installed a brand new mixer for our Church audio-visual system. We sealed
  it with Perspex to avoid eager fingers to fiddle on it. I thank Danny Gablonski,
  Mal Clancy and Paul Fenech for their well-coordinated work on fixing this
  matter.
- 3. The safety of everyone is our priority. The paved and slanty pathway from the car park to the main door of the Church is slippery when it rains. A tradesman will come next week to sort this out.
- 4. On Wednesday, March 16, a personnel from Human Resources of the Archdiocese of Brisbane and myself conducted interviews of applicants for the position of Parish Secretary. We zeroed in with Cheryl McCaffery. Cheryl and her family have been in our parish for 28 years. She will officially start her job in our parish office on Monday, April 11, as she had already a scheduled annual holiday from March 24 to April 8. Office working days and hours will remain the same.
- 5. Consequently, with Cheryl now as our parish secretary, I advised her to step aside from her post as Chairperson of the Finance Council. Thus on Thursday, March 17, I called for an extra ordinary meeting with members of the Finance Council to reorganise the office bearers. I have appointed Ravi Raveendrakumar as Chairperson and John Guiton as deputy. I also invited Muriel Mairhofer to come on board as a new member.
- 6. Some parishioners have called my attention about the problem of our car parking area (students basketball ground) especially during the Sunday 8:30am mass because of the increasing number of people coming to our parish. I will sort this out with our school administrators and listen to their advice.

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

### Let's get to know our faith.

Question: Are non-Catholics our brothers and

#### sisters? // What can we do unify Christians?

All baptized persons belong to the Church of Jesus Christ. That is why also those Christians who find themselves separated from the full communion of the Catholic Church are rightly called Christians and are therefore our sisters and brothers.

Instances of separation from the one Church of Christ came about through falsifications of Christ's teaching, human failings, and a lack of willingness to be reconciled usually on the part of representatives on both sides. Christians today are in no way guilty for the historical divisions of the Church. The Holy Spirit also works for the salvation of mankind in the Churches and ecclesial communities that are separated from the Catholic Church. All of the gifts present there, for example, Sacred Scripture, sacraments, faith,

hope, love, and other charisms, come originally from Christ. Where the Spirit of Christ lives, there is an inner dynamic leading toward "reunion", because what belongs together wants to grow together.

#### What must we do for the unity of Christians?

In word and deed we must obey Christ, who expressly wills "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Christian unity is the business of all Christians, regardless of how young or old they are. Unity was one of Jesus' most important concerns. He prayed to the Father, "that they may all be one ... so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (Jn 17:21). Divisions are like wounds on the Body of Christ; they hurt and fester. Divisions lead to enmities and weaken the faith and credibility of Christians. Overcoming the scandal of separation requires the conversion of all concerned but also knowledge of one's own faith conviction, dialogues with others, and especially prayer in common, and collaboration among Christians in serving mankind. Those in authority in the Church must not let the theological dialogue be interrupted. (YOUCAT questions 130-131)




