# Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

19th - 20th November 2016

### A TOTALLY DIFFERENT KING

The idea of Christ the King is one that is very familiar to us, and yet Christ is very different from earthly kings. The kings we have heard of and read about in books have often had to win their kingdoms in

the blood of battle. Frequently, one king met another in individual, mortal combat. The survivor was the victor. Though some kings displayed benevolence to their subjects, many kings became tyrants to their subjects. One thing all kings, no matter how powerful or extensive their kingdom, have had in common is this: death has been the end of their kingship.

How different is Christ the King! To begin with, Jesus did not win his kingdom in the blood of a battlefield, but "through his blood on the cross." His enemy was not another king, but sin itself. Though Christ died in the struggle, it was Christ and not sin who was the victor. After his victory, Christ, far from being a tyrant, has shown that he is most benevolent to his subjects.

If Christ has already won the battle of his kingdom, and if his kingdom has so much good to offer to his people for their happiness, why is it that many people still fail to recognise and accept Christ as their King? Why is it that Christ's peace, his love and his justice are not in great evidence in our world today? The reason is that sin, despite the victory of Christ, still has power in the world because people opt to do their will instead of God's will.

The situation is like the one following the war with Japan. In that war, the decisive battle had been fought and won by the United States in the summer of 1945. On August 14, 1495, Japan officially surrendered. Though there was no doubt then that United States had won the war, some fighting continued in a few islands of the Pacific in what the military referred to as "mopping-up" operations. We are like people in the final stages of a war. Christ has fought and won the decisive battle against sin and evil, and we are now in the mopping-up period. We long for the day when this struggle will be over and done with, so that all people may enjoy the peace, love and justice of Christ's kingdom. The Second Coming of Christ will mark the end of this transition period, and then will begin in all its perfection the eternal and universal reign of Christ the King!



### ST EDWARD'S PARISH COLUMBARIUM



In October 22, 2016 Pope Francis has released an official guideline on how we care for the ashes of the deceased. The Vatican document says: "The ashes of the deceased must be laid to rest in a sacred place, such as in a cemetery or columbarium". It goes on to state that "it is not permitted to keep the ashes in a home or to scatter them in the air, on land, at sea, or in some other way. Nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewellery, or other objects." In short, the Vatican says YES to cremation but NO to scattering of ashes anywhere.

The release of the above Vatican Guideline was very timely because it has been my dream in this parish at St. Edward's to establish a Columbarium. I presented this dream when I called for a joint meeting with the Pastoral and Finance Councils late last year. It was unanimously approved with great delight. The above photo is the impression of our future parish Columbarium. It is not made of bricks but granite. It is now being manufactured by National Granite Pty Ltd in Sydney and will be transported from Sydney to Daisy Hill and the whole structure will be mounted at the nominated site. The location of where the Columbarium will stand is very important to me because it faces the Altar and this will remind the priest who celebrates the Mass, to pray for the souls named on the Columbarium; and the congregation, too, will be reminded to pray for the deceased members of their families, relatives and friends. This Columbarium is divided into two parts: the 140 niches or holes where we place the ashes of the deceased; and the memorial wall (yellow part)

which is composed of small plaques, around 150 plaques, where we put the names of our departed. I hope to finish this project before Christmas. I have appointed John Winter to supervise the construction of the Columbarium. And once the project is finished, John Guiton (who is a member of our Parish Finance Council) will take over as Parish Manager of our Columbarium. This means John Guiton is the first contact person for those who are interested to make reservations or for any concerns about the Columbarium. His contact number is 3299 5233, strictly during office hours only.

Application forms and Terms and Conditions and now ready for pick up, either at the Church, or from the Parish Office. For your convenience they are also available on our Parish website www.stedwardsdaisyhill.org.au. I am greatly indebted to our Parish Office Administrator Cheryl McCaffery, who was so quick in formulating the Terms and Conditions and other paper work, with the assistance of John Guiton and John Winter. Some sources of our Terms and Conditions and other paper work were drawn from the Archdiocese of Brisbane and from other surrounding parishes who have been managing a Columbarium for so many years.
