A SNEAK PREVIEW

Rising abruptly from the cultivated plains of northern part of Israel is the famous Mount Tabor –Galilee's most picturesque mountain. This majestic, tree-covered elevation is six miles east of Nazareth.

Honoured in Jewish history as the site of a decisive victory over the Canaanites, it is hallowed by Christians as the scared scene of the transfiguration of Jesus. Atop this 1,600 foot mountain, tradition says the three privileged apostles: Peter, James and John, witnesses an astonishing change in the appearance of their Master. Bathed in glorious light (his clothes became dazzlingly white), Jesus accepted approval from the Father as His Beloved Son. Jesus also received support from two of the most outstanding names in Hebrew history – Moses and Elijah. The Lord's radiant splendour, previously disguised, here stood revealed.

The transfiguration of Jesus was a sneak preview of His resurrection and was the closest glimpse of heaven that Peter, James and John had ever seen. Mesmerised by all of this, Peter expressed a strong desire to remain on the mountain when he said to Jesus: "Lord, it is good for us to be here. Let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." Peter, James and John would be content to sleep in the open, if only they could stay.

Gradually, the two Old Testament celebrities (Moses and Elijah) faded into the thin mountain air, as did the emphatic request of Peter. Sufficient would be the memory, since it was not God's plan for the Redeemer and His apostles to settle on the mountain, basking in a care-free glory. "This is my Beloved Son," had been proclaimed at Jesus' baptism at Jordan River, and now again these words were repeated with the Father's additional advice: "Listen to Him!" This event moved Jesus to begin speaking openly of his coming passion, death and resurrection. Before they made a descend from Mt. Tabor, Jesus told to Peter, James and John: "Tell the vision to no one until the Son of Man has risen from the dead."

There is goodness and glory in all of us – often unseen and unappreciated by others and even by ourselves. God sees more than meets the human eye and it is His grace that makes us truly beautiful. It is good to remember that, especially in hard times. Jesus must have recalled Mount Tabor when he climbed his next mount – Calvary. The memory helped him to know that the Father had not forsaken him.

Lent is our transfiguration time, to be achieved through reconciliation, the Eucharist, good works and prayers and fasting. During this season of reform, we are encouraged to deepen our internal attractiveness. There is a hidden beauty in all, especially in those souls approved by God. They are gradually being transfigured into everlasting glory.

Get-Together with PPC, PFC and School Admin: The secret of working together as a team is to create a good relationship and bonding with different groups. On Thursday, Feb 25, at 7pm is set for a moment of reflection for all members of our Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils, together with our school administrators. The spiritual reflection will focus on Christian Service. Dinner will follow at the hospitality area.

Logan Deanery: Priests assigned in Logan Deanery will meet bi-monthly to discuss matters related to their pastoral works. On Feb 25 Thursday is our first meeting for this year. Logan Deanery is composed of 8 parishes: Beaudesert, Beenleigh, Browns Plains, Kingston-Marsden, Loganholme, Woodridge, Rochedale and Daisy Hill. Surely I will update our parishioners of things discussed at table that are of interest for the public.

Removal of Asbestos at School: Please read the school section in our newsletter in regards to details in this matter. Bronwyn and myself have been in constant communication regarding the process of removing asbestos-affected areas of the school to insure the maximum safety of those at school and coming to the church. Some parts of our parking area at the basketball court will be affected. The work will commence on Feb 27 (Saturday) and hopefully it will be finished by the end of Easter break.

Sacramental Programme: This year, our parish implements the revision made by the Archbishop regarding of the Sacramental Programme. The archbishop would like to give the Sacraments gradually. Hence, for this year, only the Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered for year 3 students (and those who would like to participate). In 2017, Confirmation for Year 3 and First Communion for Year 4. In 2018, Confirmation for Year 3, First Communion for Year 4 and Reconciliation for Year 5. This means, our candidates for Confirmation this year will only receive First Communion in 2017, and Reconciliation in 2018.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME – CONFIRMATION

As per Fr Marce's advice in last week's newsletter, I am pleased to lead our Sacramental Team. We met this week to map our journey until Confirmation takes place Thursday April 28.

The Archdiocese of Brisbane 3rd sacramental policy was launched by Archbishop Mark Coleridge last year. The policy brings changes to the order of receiving sacraments, reverting back to early Church years. Our Parish, like other Parishes within the Archdiocese has adapted our programme to align with the new policy. (Some copies of the new policy are available at the back of the Church). This year Grade 3 students

(approx. 8 years of age) will receive the 2nd sacrament of initiation, Confirmation. Confirmation renews our baptismal promises.

We have approximately.... enrolled and we would ask that you pray for these candidates and their parents as they prepare. We have also extended our invitation for candidates to join us from John Paul College and our 5 other neighboring schools.

Each year, the staff identifies areas of development from core areas of educating in a Catholic school. In each area, data from the previous year's review helps guide goals to improve in these areas. formation.

- 2. To build on the shared language of learning with a focus on learning progress and process within teaching and learning.
- 3. Professional communication sharing and dialogue- develop online platforms and network groups.

One of his major projects recently has been preparing the Year 4 laptops which, due to his hard work and a little help from some of the students, will be ready to use come Monday. The One-to-One

program has proved a real success since its inception in 2013, with all students in Years 4, 5 and 6 using laptops to support and enhance their learning.

Last year with our theme- 'Practise Peace, Change your World' our Yr. 6 students made over 1000

paper cranes to send to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial. Last week we received some pictures and an update on their work and it is great we made a difference in our world...read inset.

We are currently accepting enrolment applications for students to commence Prep next year. Children born between 1 July 2011 and 30 June 2012 are eligible for enrolment. We particularly urge parents with children already at the school to attend to this matter sooner rather than later to ensure we are aware of current family needs.

Over the next few months the school will be going through a process of removing all asbestos from the site. A contractor has been appointed to this role and will be working on weekends and during the Easter holiday to complete this task. The first scheduled day of removal is Saturday 27th February and will continue the following weekends until the end of the Easter break. An inspection of all BCE workplaces built before 1990 was completed

by Pacific Power International (PPI) in 2002. Work from these inspections lead to the development of the asbestos register. In accordance to workplace health and safety regulations all asbestos products have been strictly monitored for their condition. Brisbane Catholic Education has supported the funding of removal of all asbestos from schools and we have the official go ahead to begin this project.

This week we meditate on the story of the Transfiguration where Jesus took Peter, James and John up to the mountain. Here they were privileged to be present to such a sacred and an awe-filled moment in Jesus' life but they were also lacking in their knowledge of who Jesus really is. They were "heavy with sleep" a euphemistic way of saying they had no understanding of what Jesus was trying to tell them even though, eight days previously, He had told them what was about to happen in the words "I tell you truly, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God." (Luke 9: 27). The question is are we "heavy with sleep. "Are we discerning where God is leading us, what is He asking of us.

Love of God and love of neighbour are the basic fundamentals of Christian life. Pope Francis reminds us of our obligation as Christians in (Evangelii Gaudium). He states "responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation". This is reinforced by Pope Benedict when he states "All Christians have a moral obligation to strive for what he calls the "common good". (Caritas in Veritate). In our present society one sees many injustices - ones that are not for the common good - Asylum seekers, People living in appalling conditions in detention centres, children being returned to Nauru. Together let us be the voice for these people especially the children by supporting the stance taken by the personnel of the Mater Hospital. We can support and applaud the Premier of Victoria who is prepared to take all the children. He has offered to house them, school them and take care of their medical needs. Support for this cause can be given through the various media outlets -Facebook etc.
