YOU CAN RUN, BUT YOU CAN'T HIDE

One focus of our Gospel reading today is: ***So do not be afraid of them. There is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known.*** (Matthew 10:26)

In Psalm 139:7-10, the psalmist knew that hiding from God was a fruitless enterprise. *“Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.* The psalmist also knew, and described in various graphic passages such as Psalm 51, that it was his sin that drove him to try to hide from God and which erected a wall of separation between him and God.


The very first human sin led the very first humans (Adam and Eve) to hide from God. *Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden* (Genesis 1:8). Earlier, they had tried to hide their nakedness, newly understood because of their sin. *“Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves* (Genesis 1:7). We have been hiding from God ever since.
 - Why do we hide our wrong doings from others?

When you get in trouble and are caught hiding something you knew you shouldn't have been doing. We say we are sorry. But Are we truly sorry about what we did or are we sorry we were caught? There is no hiding of sin. *“You know my folly, O God; my guilt is not hidden from you.”* (Psalm 69:5)

You Can Run, But You Can't Hide!

How much better to acknowledge and repent of our sins, and say with David: *“Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity. Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.”* (Psalm 51:9-10)

When you get in trouble you feel bad don't you? But when you finally come clean about what you did and say you're sorry, doesn't that take a load off your shoulders? You just can't help to not feel better after saying you're sorry.



Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Q What did God create?

Sacred Scripture says, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth" (*Genesis 1:1*). The Church in her profession of faith proclaims that God is the Creator of everything, visible and invisible, of all spiritual and corporeal beings, that is, of angels and of the visible world and, in a special way, of man.

Q Who are the angels?

The angels are purely spiritual creatures, incorporeal, invisible, immortal, and personal beings endowed with intelligence and will. They ceaselessly contemplate God face-to-face and they glorify him. They serve him and are his messengers in the accomplishment of his saving mission to all.

Q In what way are angels present in the life of the Church?

The Church joins with the angels in adoring God, invokes their assistance and commemorates some in her liturgy.

Q. In what sense do we understand man and woman as created "in the image of God"?

The human person is created in the image of God in the sense that he or she is capable of knowing and of loving their Creator in freedom. Human beings are the only creatures on earth that God has willed for their own sake and has called to share, through knowledge and love, in his own divine life. All human beings, in as much as they are created in the image of God, have the dignity of a person. A person is not something but someone, capable of self-knowledge and of freely giving himself and entering into communion with God and with other persons.

Q. For what purpose did God create man and woman?

God has created everything for them; but he has created them to know, serve and love God, to offer all of creation in this world in thanksgiving back to him and to be raised up to life with him in heaven. Only in the mystery of the incarnate Word does the mystery of the human person come into true light. Man and woman are predestined to reproduce the image of the Son of God made Man who is the perfect "image of the invisible God" (*Colossians 1:15*).

Q. Why does the human race form a unity?

All people form the unity of the human race by reason of the common origin which they have from God. God has made "from one ancestor all the nations of men" (*Acts 17:26*). All have but one Savior and are called to share in the eternal happiness of God.

Q. How does the soul and body form a unity in the human being?

The human person is a being at once corporeal and spiritual. In man spirit and matter form one nature. This unity is so profound that, thanks to the spiritual principle which is the soul, the body which is material, becomes a living human body and participates in the dignity of the image of God.
