"LIVE AND LET LIVE"

We are all familiar with the slogan of California: "Live and let live." This sounds wonderfully mature, liberal and trusting of the other. We don't step on each other's turf. We have differences, but we respect them and keep on our way. You do your thing and I will do mine. I respect your space and you respect mine. At times, however, such an attitude must be translated as: "Live and let die." For our so-called live and let live attitude can really be a mask for indifference, for a desire not to get involved or committed. We see friends destroying themselves, and we keep hands off lest we seem to be meddling in the private affairs of others. We see many opportunities for doing good, and we let them pass because we don't want to get involved. Yes, "live and let live" can have some serious defects.



This is the case of the story of the rich man and Lazarus in today's Gospel reading. The rich man engages in conspicuous consumption. He feasts splendidly every day. He wears the finest clothes. Outside his home is the beggar named Lazarus. His body is covered with sores. Lazarus would be satisfied with the scraps that fall from the rich man's table. The poor man, Lazarus, was *invisible*. This is the main problem in our society today. The poor are invisible. They are not seen, heard or considered when plans are made and reactions are considered.

This holds very true in poor countries. A large portion of a country is dominated by a high percentage of poor ones but they do not count. What the poor feel, think, desire and hope are of no account. We can ignore them. Each of us can take comfort in "doing our own thing." We see only what we want to see. We value what serves our own personal interests. We hear the music of feasting, so the hollow sounds of our souls do not find their way to our consciousness, or our conscience.

Our Gospel today from St. Luke tells us that "dogs even came and licked his sores." Lazarus is *visible* to the dogs. God reaches out to Lazarus more than the rich man who continues to feast. But Lazarus is the rich man's

hope of salvation. It is only *if* Lazarus is *visible* to the rich man that he can hope to possess what is of lasting value. However, the rich man's wealth and greed have fixed his eyes on the visible and the immediate. At times, we, too, continue to search for more and more in hope that someday we will have enough security and peace.

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Question: What is the sacrament of Penance?

Penance is the sacrament by which sins committed after Baptism are forgiven through the absolution of the priest.

Question: How does a priest have the power to forgive sins?

The priest has the power to forgive sins from Jesus Christ, who said to His apostles and to their successors in the priesthood: "Receive the Holy Ghost; whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained."

Receive the Holy Ghost; whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained. (John 20:22-23) CCC 1440-1449

Question: With what words does the priest forgive sins?

The priest forgives sins with the words: "I absolve thee from thy sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen."

Question: What are the effects of the sacrament of Penance, worthily received?

The effects of the sacrament of Penance, worthily received, are:

- 1. the restoration or increase of sanctifying grace;
- 2. the forgiveness of sins:
- 3. the remission of the eternal punishment, if necessary, and also of part, at least, of the temporal punishment, due to our sins:
- 4. the help to avoid sin in future;
- 5. the restoration of the merits of our good works if they have been lost by mortal sin.
