13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

'Follow in my footsteps ...'

In this week's readings we hear about the choices that have to be made in living a life in Christ, as well as of God's generosity to anyone who welcomes a prophet or disciple.

This is illustrated in the **First Reading**, where God rewards the repeated kindnesses of a childless couple towards the prophet Elisha with the gift of a child.

The **Psalm** is full of praise for the Lord, expressing the psalmist's joy and trust in the Lord's everlasting love and faithfulness.

In the **Second Reading**, St Paul emphasises that in baptism we are dying to our old self, to sin, and moving into a new life lived in Christ.

The **Gospel** sees Jesus continuing to instruct the disciples in their mission, telling them of the demands in following his way. But he also assures them of God's great generosity – both to them and also to anyone who welcomes them. In doing so, they are welcoming Jesus himself, and even the smallest kindness will be rewarded.

This week, perhaps I might pray for the grace to follow Christ more nearly, to see him more clearly, and to love him more dearly as I welcome him in others.

GOSPEL

Matthew 10: 37–42 REFLECTION

As I enter slowly into prayer, I become aware of God's gentle presence within me and let his love embrace me. I ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten me as I read the Gospel prayerfully. I linger over anything that touches me.

Perhaps some of these words challenge me. I take time to reflect. Are there times when I might have put other things before God? I share these with the Lord, remembering that I am always loved and forgiven.

Jesus says, 'Follow in my footsteps'. How might he be inviting me to do this now ... in my work, my family, my community? Maybe I feel drawn to ponder what might be my own cross right now.

Is it perhaps a particular situation in which I find myself? Or is it perhaps simply in accepting my own weaknesses? I remember that Jesus is walking alongside me and loves me just as I am, my unique self.

Perhaps I can imagine being welcomed with a cup of cold water in the heat – how refreshing and good that is! – such a little gesture, but meaning so much. I reflect with gratitude on the little gestures that I have seen, given or received myself. What might the Lord be saying to me now? How would I like to respond ... whether in words from my heart, or just resting in his presence?

When I am ready, I end my prayer with a slow sign of the cross.

It was wonderful to see all those parishioners who attended our Masses over the last week with our increased numbers.

Remember to use our booking system when you wish to attend any of our Masses. Please follow the steps below to register your booking. If you do not have a computer please call the office 3299 2000 to make your booking.

The steps for the registration is as follows:

The easiest process is to go to our webpage

www.stedwardsdaisyhill.org.au and click on the icon provided.

- Click on 'Select a Date'
- Scroll down until you find the date you require
- Then click 'Ticket'
- The next screen you can choose the number of tickets you require (1 or 2 etc) if you are living in the same house and have the same surname you can do this on the one booking otherwise you have to do separate bookings for each one. There is a limit of 4 tickets per booking so if there is more than 4 required you need to do separate bookings.
- Click 'see more' to read all the conditions of the booking
- Then click 'Register'
- That will take you to the screen when you can enter your details. In the area 'First name' you can enter all (up to 4) first names (if you have ordered multiple tickets with the one booking) then tab to the surname area. This is for all attendees that have the same surname and living at the same address. ALL NAMES ARE TO BE REGISTERED
- All the information with a * is required by the guidelines which are to be hold on record for 56 days.
- Once you click 'Register' at the bottom of this page you will receive a confirmation of the booking to your email.

Reconciliation will still be by appointment ONLY.
