AUTHORITY, FREEDOM AND LOVE

In the early Church there arose a problem about transferring Jewish rules and regulations into the new Christian community. Gentile converts to the Christian community could not see why they had to be coerced into following practices which had nothing to do with the Church founded by Jesus. The matter of circumcision was particularly con-

troversial. When this

problem came to the attention of the apostles and elders in Jerusalem, they discussed the issue at length and came to a conclusion: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit, and ours too, not to lay on you any burden beyond that which is strictly necessary. And the burden that was laid upon them was a disciplinary thing because of the culture of the time. Hence, the idea that circumcision was necessary for any member of the Christian community was definitely rejected.

This episode in the early Church involved the importance of freedom which human dignity demands. No one in authority should lay on others a burden beyond that which is strictly necessary. We find that many times in life, in our care and concern for those under our authority, there is a tendency to exaggerate the kinds of decisions that must be made. This exaggeration can be found among parents with children, pastors with their parishioners, heads of institutions and schools with their students.

Today we celebrate God's goodness in giving us enlightenment in this troublesome problem. In the Gospel today we will hear the words of Jesus: "Anyone who loves me will be true to my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come and make our dwelling place with him always." Love is the crucial point in regard to the exercise of authority as well as to the submission to authority. Of course it is easy to talk about such love, and very hard to put it into practice. But difficulty is no excuse for not trying, since love is the only answer. Everyone with any kind of authority must ask himself: "Why do I lay down rules and regulations? What is my motive?" On the other hand, when we are subject to authority, we must also ask ourselves questions. When we insist on our freedom, do we have only in mind only our own convenience, our whims, our self-indulgence?

These days, we are suffering turmoil and conflicts in society, in the Church, in schools, and in our own homes (families). In trying to solve our problems of authority and freedom, let us do so with a hopeful attitude. Through the Holy Spirit we can be as successful with the problem of authority and freedom as were the apostles and the early

Christians. Then we will know the meaning of the words of Jesus:

"Peace is my farewell to you, peace is my gift to you."



Parish Update An Invitation for Reflection

Our modern world is starved of silence and Holy Mass should be a privileged moment to escape the hustle and bustle of daily life and, through worship and participation in Christ's eternal sacrifice, become capable of giving an eternal value to these same daily and transitory activities.

To help achieve this, we should foment by all available means the spirit of attentive and active silence in our celebrations and refrain from importing the world's clamor and clatter into their midst.

The gathering rite gives a formal beginning to our Mass and sets the mood. It is helpful to have this start, so that we all know that this is the time to open ourselves more fully to the presence of God and to leave our preoccupation with schedules, plans, and other daily concerns behind.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM 45) directs that *even* before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner."One may observe that most of those who come earlier before the Mass starts, they sit down properly and quietly. Do we know what they are doing at that moment? **THEY'RE PRAYING!** Perhaps they pray to God for their worries and concerns in life. But whatever issues they may bring to God in their moment of personal prayer, they deserve to be respected by us. Hence, there is a need to be quiet inside the Church before the Mass. Everyone needs to dispose himself or herself before the Mass because it is a moment of personal encounter between the Divine and human!

To be punctual is part of character building. Punctuality is a virtue! It speaks of our recognition and respect for others created and fashioned in the image and likeness of God. Ideally, we should make it a habit to arrive in church at least 10 minutes before Mass begins. As we compose ourselves, amidst all the worldly distractions, this is a wonderful opportunity to pray and reflect upon what we are about to celebrate. Those who are late should wait to be seated at the appropriate moment so as not to disrupt the attentive listening people to the Word of God. We need to respect the Lord who is speaking to His people, and at the same time, we also need to respect the listeners.

Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Let's get to know our faith.

Question:

How does the Church view other religions?

The Church respects everything in other religions that is good and true. She respects and promotes freedom of religion as a human right. Yet she knows that Jesus Christ is the sole redeemer of all mankind. He alone is "the way, and the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6).

Whoever seeks God is close to us Christians. There is a special degree of "affinity" to the Muslims. Like Judaism and Christianity, Islam is one of the monotheistic religions (monotheism). The Muslims, too, revere God the Creator and Abraham as their father in faith. Jesus is considered a great prophet in the Qur'an; Mary, his Mother, as the mother of a prophet. The Church teaches that all men who by no fault of their own do not know Christ and his Church but sincerely seek God and follow the voice of their conscience can attain eternal salvation. However, anyone who has recognized that Jesus Christ is "the way, and the truth, and the life" but is unwilling to follow him cannot find salvation by other paths. This is what is meant by the saying, *Extra ecclesiam nulla salus* (outside of the Church there is no salvation). (YOUCAT question 136)
