WE ARE MADE FOR IMMORTALITY

This weekend, I focus my spiritual sharing in this newsletter on our first reading today from the Book of Wisdom. Its first sentence goes like this: ***Death was not God's doing, he takes no pleasure of the extinction of the living...***

“God did not make death ... God established man for immortality” (1:13; 2:23). You and I were created for immortality. Adam and Eve were never supposed to die.

“God did not make death” (1:13). Science tries to teach us that death is a natural part of life. But God didn't create man to die. “God established man for immortality” (2:23). Death was the furthest thing from God's plan when He said the world was “very good” on the sixth day of Creation (Genesis 1:31). Adam and Eve were set in the Garden of Eden to spend eternity there with all their descendants. As Jesus told the Sadducees, “Have you not read what was said to you by God: ‘I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob’? He is not the God of the dead, but of the living” (Matthew 22:31-32). Even though Abraham, Isaac and Jacob died and were buried centuries before, God is still their God. “I am” not “I was”. Jesus continued the thought outside Jairus' house, “Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping” (Mark 5:39).

“But by the devil's envy death entered into the world” (2:24). The devil cannot deal with God's steadfast love and compassion. He deals with envy and jealousy. Through his intrusion, Satan introduced death into the world. “The wages of sin is death,” St. Paul says in Romans 6:23. We die because we have sinned. No one on the face of the earth has died and it wasn't because of sin.

“God established man for immortality, and with His own everlasting image He made him” (2:23). You were created for immortality. You were created for everlasting life. Jesus has assured you of this with His death on the cross. He offers you this assurance in the water of your Baptism. For many of you that was decades ago. So He also offers you this

assurance in His body and blood given and shed for you. Given to you in the bread and wine on this table. Your immortality is sure because these signs remind you of Jesus' sacrifice for you.


Safeguarding Children and the Vulnerable in the Parish Community



As we all know, the Royal Commission released last December its findings after years of thorough investigation of the problem that plagued the Catholic Church and other institutions in Australia. In response, the Archdiocese of Brisbane is now implementing strict policies for all those who are working or volunteering in the parish community. All priests and deacons have already done our part: police check and blue card.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge has implemented that all parish volunteers in the Archdiocese, whether working directly with children or not, should undergo a police check and hold a blue card. In response to this call, our parish office through John Wood (our Safeguarding Coordinator) and Cheryl McCaffery (our parish secretary) have been busy in communicating to all our parish volunteers to comply with the requirements. I therefore encourage all those who work with our parish community as volunteers, 18 years old and above, to please cooperate with the mandate from the Archbishop. This is to create a healthy and a safe environment for all. Should you require any clarification in this regard, please do not hesitate to contact our parish office. We are happy to assist you.

- In the Archdiocese of Brisbane, we take this collection up as a retiring collection.


This means that we will have collectors at each of the exits of the church so you can have the opportunity to support the charitable works.

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH Basic questions answered according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Q. What is required to receive Holy Communion?
To receive Holy Communion one must be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church and be in the state of grace, that is, not conscious of being in mortal sin. Anyone who is conscious of having committed a grave sin must first receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion. Also important for those receiving Holy Communion are a spirit of recollection and prayer, observance of the fast prescribed by the Church, and an appropriate disposition of the body (gestures and dress) as a sign of respect for Christ.

Q. What are the fruits of Holy Communion?
Holy Communion increases our union with Christ and with his Church. It preserves and renews the life of grace received at Baptism and Confirmation and makes us grow in love for our neighbour. It strengthens us in charity, wipes away venial sins and preserves us from mortal sin in the future.
